

# 2. INSTITUTE AT A GLANCE

Government College of Arts and Science, Aurangabad is a premier institution in the Marathwada region of Maharashtra state. Being a government institution, it caters to the academic needs of the under privileged classes on a large scale. The history of this college is the history of Higher education in Marathwada region. The college was established on 22nd Sept.1923 at Aurangabad, the capital of Marathwada. It was established initially at Madrasa-a-Fokania, first floor, near Bhadkal Gate, Aurangabad. Founder Principal was Dr. Maulvi Abdul Hak. The college was previously affiliated to renowned university namely Osmania University, Hyderabad up to 1954 prior to establishment of Dr.Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad previously named as Marathwada University. Institute offers UG courses of Arts and Science faculty. It runs three Post graduate programs in Music, Home Science and Geography. Institute offers English and Marathi medium for arts faculty. College has been accredited by NAAC for second cycle in 2016.College has initiated various developments under RUSA grants.

The institute inculcates moral values and awareness regarding social responsibility. Institute attempts to create intellectual stimulating atmosphere with academic activities.
